

INSTRUCTIONS IN CASE OF EMERGENCY



Once your boat is docked in the marina,

FIRE ALARM

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

BOAT IN DISTRESS

- 1 Operate the alarm next to SOS pedestal.
- 2 Call for help using the numbers below and inform of your location.
- 3 If you are able, remain near the boat in distress to assist in case the people on board must evacuate.

FIRE ON A BOAT OR ELSEWHERE

- 1 Operate the fire alarm next to SOS pedestal.
- 2 Call for help using the numbers below and inform the location
- 3 Exit to the shore or seaward from nearest exit gate

MAN OVERBOARD IN MARINA

- 1 Operate the alarm next to SOS pedestal.
- 2 Throw the nearest lifebuoy to the person in distress.
- 3 Call for help using the numbers below and inform your location.
- 4 Use any available methods to assist the MOB, e.g. ropes, fenders, poles, ladders.
- 5 Stay with the person until the emergency services arrive – you may be contacted again to provide further information

SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS

- 1 All light and loose items to be stowed away securely
- 2 Adjust and/or add lines of vessels accordingly
- 3 Call for help using the numbers below and inform of your location

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

- 1 Call 999/998 and request an ambulance or call for help using the numbers below and inform of your location.
- 2 Marina's staff will assist with directing emergency services and can be on site with an emergency first aid kit.
- 3 Paramedic service available in the marina.

OIL SPILL/ ENVIROMENTAL POLLUTION

If an oil spill occurs, contact our marina staff immediately. We are trained to handle this type of emergency.

**WHILE WAITING
FOR HELP**

Don't board a boat that is on fire or in distress; wait for the marina staff and emergency services.
It is advisable not to move injured people unless you are a qualified first aid responder.
